

What is the Leisure Access Card Program?

The Leisure Access Card Program provides Vancouver Residents who are in financial need with basic recreation opportunities.

Who is the Leisure Access Card Program for?

Permanent Vancouver residents who are living in low income and meet the criteria (see Family Income table below). Residents who live with their family in one household must include total income for all adults in the household in the application.

How to apply?

Application forms are available at your local community centre or pool or download the form from our website:

www.vancouver.ca/parks/rec/access



When should I apply?

Applicants may apply once a year at any time during the year.

Who is not eligible for the LAC Program?

Immigrants classified as investors, and entrepreneurs do not qualify as well as those on temporary permit, study or work permit. Residents who live on UBC Endowment Lands are also not eligible.

How to register for skating or swimming lesson with a LAC card?

Valid LAC card must be presented at time of registration to receive LAC benefits and lesson discounts.



Please note the following definitions apply to the Leisure Access Card Program:

What is a family?

Those who live at the same address including all extended family members of all ages, related by blood, common law, adoption or marriage. Same address also includes separate living areas in the same house (e.g. grandparents, siblings, each of whom may occupy one floor of multi-unit house or share single rooms in the house are considered one family.

What is a total family income?

Total combined income, before taxes, by all family members in Canada and abroad, contributing to the Vancouver household. This includes income from: employment of all types (full and part-time, reported or not reported) Investments, pensions, child support payments, rental revenues, funds in trust, disability benefits, overseas income and business income and all other sources.

LAC cards are not transferable. Misused cards will be confiscated

Are you a MSD Applicant? (**Fastrack**)
 Are you receiving BC Benefits Income Assistance? You have two choices:

1:
 Bring an original Ministry of Social Development (**MSD**) application form. This form must be completed, signed and stamped from your Financial Worker **plus**, government issued photo ID and recent proof of address in Vancouver to the nearest community centre or pool for a **LAC** card.

OR

2:
 Bring completed (**MSD**) application form, proof of income assistance (payment stub or Ministry Transit Pass), government issued photo ID and recent proof of address in Vancouver to the nearest community centre or pool for a **LAC** card
